Jim Van Etten prepared draft papers entitled:

- i What Is U.S. National Navigation Policy?
- ii What Is The WGA?

Van Etten briefed his Critical Issues papers and solicited advise from the attendees. Fehlner suggested that the WGA should get a list together of focal points for promoting awareness of Loran-C... non-DOT federal agencies, state and local government personnel, major transportation organizations, etc. The approach might be "here are the facts (truth as we know it) re Loran-C capabilities and projected costs. The WGA should attempt to stimulate support through follow-up efforts.

In addition to the problems presented in his report Van Etten raised the issue of stronger effort to clear the band at and near Loran-C frequency. He described efforts of Utilities and others to utilize the frequency as a carrier for internal control signals.

8. At approximately 10:45 a.m. the meeting was recessed to receive briefings from Dr. Goldsmith and later Dr. Farnside. Considerable discussion ensued regarding the conflict between policies and philosophy of the NPN and plans presented by GAO and OMB. The DOT position was clearly stated and ideas were sought for presentation of arguments before the appropriate committees of the House of Representatives.

The DOT position stands upon the authority and responsibilities assigned it by the Congress under U.S. Code Title 14.

Considerable effort is to be expended by DOT through FAA, USCG and the newly-formed Research & Special Programs Administration (which operates the TSC) to demonstrate maturity of ideas, competence, cost effectiveness of DOT-selected systems, long range plans, etc.

(Note: there are three parallel major programs to demonstrate feasibility of Loran-C in addition to its accepted maritime role . . .

- i The St. Lawrence Seaway
- ii AVM and Site Location (Land Navigation) within the State of New York
- iii Aircraft Area Nav and Instrument Approach feasibility in rural areas (Vermont)

Success with these programs can have a major effect on authorization for mid-continent Loran-C.) Secretary's Note.

- 9. The Board recessed for lunch at 12:30 p.m. and reconvened at 1330 hours.

Leo Fehlner presented a motion for consideration which would provide funds for reimbursement of certain expenses of individuals invited to address the Convention this fall:

Motion: It is moved that the WGAApay the travel and hotel expenses for not more than two (2) guest speakers for the annual convention; local travel expenses are not to be included. Hotel expenses will be for a period of one (1) day. In addition, each of the guests will be provided with two (2) free banquet and two (2) free luncheon tickets.

The motion was not voted on because of lack of a quorum.

There being no other business Van Etten moved that the Meeting be adjourned. The motion was seconded by Fehlner. Motion approved and Meeting adjourned at 14:30 p.m.
