MINUTES OF THE 55TH BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

THE MEETING WAS HELD IN THE 8TH FLOOR CONFERENCE ROOM OF THE UNION BANK BUILDING, 400 OCEANGATE, LONG BEACH, CA. THE FOLLOWING DIRECTORS WERE PRESENT:

MEMBER J. O. ALEXANDER WAS ALSO PRESENT.

THE NUMBER OF DIRECTORS PRESENT DID NOT MEET THE REQUIREMENTS FOR A QUORUM. NO NEW BUSINESS WAS CONDUCTED. DISCUSSIONS WERE HELD IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE AGENDA AS FOLLOWS:

1. THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER AT 2:45 PM BY PRESI-DENT AMBROSENO.

2. COMMITTEE REPORTS

- A. 1982 CONVENTION PROGRESS. CHAIRMAN DAVE CARTER REPORTS ALL ITEMS ON SCHEDULE, EXCEPT THAT NOT ALL TECHNICAL PAPERS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED. HE MADE A SPECIAL MAILING (EXHIBIT 2) TO A LIST OF NON-MEMBERS SOLICITING PAPERS. IT IS REPORTED THAT DAVE WILSHIRE WILL BE THE BANQUET SPEAKER AND ADM. BAUMAN WILL ADDRESS ONE LUNCHEON.
- THE LISTING OF OMEGA CHARTS IN JOURNAL PROGRESS. В. AND IT WAS AGREED THAT THEY WAS DISCUSSED THE JOURNAL TO WARRANT INTEREST TO THE MEMBERSHIP OF SUFFICIENT TOM THE JOURNAL IS COMING IN ADVERTISING FOR CONTINUING THEM. SLOWLY, AND THERE ARE STILL DELINQUENT ACCOUNTS DATING BACK TO 1979.
- C. MEMBERSHIP. PRES. AMBROSENO REPORTED THAT L. HIGGINBOTHAM PLANS TO RESIGN HIS POST AS MEMBERSHIP CHAIR-MAN, WHICH WILL LEAVE THE PRESENT POSTOFFICE BOX UNATTEND-ED. IT WILL BE NECESSARY TO FIND A NEW CHAIRMAN AND BOX.

- D. FINANCIAL STATUS FOR PROCEEDINGS. W. DEAN SUBMITTED ACCOUNTING FOR EXPENDITURES FOR THE 1981 CONVENTION AND MAILINGS (EXHIBIT 3). HE ESTIMATED THAT AN ADDITIONAL \$1500 WILL BE NEEDED TO COMPLETE THE PROCEEDINGS, WHICH WILL LEAVE THE CONVENTION WITH A NET DEFICIT OF APPROXIMATELY \$1000.
- E. PROCEEDINGS STATUS. J. ILLGEN STATED THAT ONLY ONE PAPER (AUTHOR NAMELESS) IS DELINQUENT. THE PUBLICATION SHOULD BE WITHIN THE MONTH.
- F. TREASURER'S REPORT. C. ANDREN SUBMITTED HIS RE-PORT SHOWING A BALANCE OF \$4,281.28 (EXHIBIT 4). INCLUDED IS A LIST OF DELINQUENT ADVERTISERS IN THE JOURNAL. 3. OTHER BUSINESS
- A. STATUS OF VERDES CONTRACT. W. DEAN STATED THAT A FORMAL REFLY TO L. FEHLNER'S LETTER WILL BE MADE BEFORE THE END OF JUNE.
 - B. WHAT IS NEW WITH LORAN/GFS STATUS. NOTHING.
- C. STATUS OF WEST COAST ASF CORRECTIONS. J. ALEXANDER STATED THAT THE MEASUREMENTS FROM PT. CONCEPTION TO STRAITS OF JUAN DE FUCA WERE JUST COMPLETED. J. ILLGEN INDICATED SOME DISCREPANCIES IN THE EARLIER MEASUREMENTS IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BY THE NOAA VESSEL RAINIER.
- D. ANY NEW CHANGES IN CHAIN STRUCTURE. A DISCUSSION ENSUED OF THE APPARENT PROLIFERATION OF NEW LORAN CHAINS OVERSEAS. THESE INCLUDE THE SAUDI CHAIN WHICH IS NOW PLANNED TO BE TWO CHAINS WITH A TOTAL OF SEVEN STATIONS. THE FRENCH ARE PLANNING A TWO-STATION CHAIN, WITH ONE NEAR THE BORDER OF SPAIN AND THE OTHER ABOUT 100 MILES NORTH OF BREST. THERE IS TALK OF A POSSIBLE THIRD STATION IN IRELAND. KUWAIT IS APPARENTLY LOOKING FOR A MINICHAIN, THE EXACT COVERAGE NOT BEING KNOWN TO THE BOARD.
- J. ALEXANDER STATED HIS CONCERN THAT COORDINATION OF NEW CHAINS, SPECIFICALLY WITH REGARD TO GRI SELECTION, APPEARED TO BE LACKING. HE ALSO MENTIONED THE TWO RUSSIAN CHAINS, ABOUT WHICH LITTLE IS KNOWN, AND SUGGESTED THAT THE WGA CONTACT THE RUSSIANS FOR DATA ON THESE CHAINS. HE ALSO STATED THAT THE COMMANDO LION CHAIN IS A MILITARY CHAIN NOT UNDER COAST GUARD CONTROL.
- E. COAST GUARD SUB-COMMITTEE. THE CONCENSUS WAS THAT B. AMBROSENO SHOULD CONTACT CHAIRMAN G. STUDDS TO LEARN HOW WITNESSES ARE BEING SELECTED AND WHO WILL BE THE ACTUAL PERSON TO ORGANIZE THE HEARINGS. WHEN THAT IS DETERMINED, WGA WILL BE BETTER ABLE TO DECIDE HOW TO PROCEED TO SUPPORT LORAN IN THE RADIONAVIGATION PLAN.
