MINUTES OF THE 62nd MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The 62nd meeting of the Board was held as scheduled Wednesday, 12 October 1983, in Conference Room 3200, NASSIF Building, 400 Seventh Street, S. W., Washington, DC.

The number of Directors present met the requirement for a quorum. All members of the Executive Committee were present. The agenda is presented as Exhibit 1.

Item 1 - Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by President Carl Andren at 0947, 12 October 1983.

Item 2 - Secretary's Report

The minutes of the last meeting of the Board were accepted as distributed to the Directors on a motion by Carter, seconded by Dean. Motion carried.

Fehlner reported on the status of the membership and distributed to the Directors a copy of the membership records as of 4 October 1983. Almost all individual member records are now updated as a result of the mailing to members made in August. However most organization member records are still stale. Effort is continuing to update the records of Organization members.

Fehlner read selected letters from the Secretary's general correspondence file which indicate much interest in the WGA on the part of members.

Fehlner also reported that evidence of the WGA tax exempt status has finally been obtained from the IRS. Copies of the IRS letter are available if needed. One copy will be sent to Maryland to obtain tax exempt status from the state.* See Exhibit 2.

Fehlner requested help in finding a number of addresses of members whose mail had been returned by the Post Office.

Item 3 - Treasurer's Report

Carter discussed the Treasurer's Report. See Exhibit 3. The report was accepted as presented on a motion by Johnson, seconded by Dean. Motion carried.

Item 4 - Standing Committees Reports

a. Awards - Chairman Bob Frank announced the awards to be made at the Convention banquet and submitted his report. See Exhibit 4.

b. Constitution -

- (1) By-Laws Change The By-Laws change submitted to the Directors for voting by mail following the last meeting of the Board was approved by a two thirds majority of the Board. See minutes of 61st meeting for text approved.
- (2) Resolution re: Executive Committee Meetings Carter moved to adopt the resolution presented by Chairman Johnson. Dean seconded. Motion carried. Text of adopted resolution is contained in Exhibit 5.

c. Convention -

- (1) 1982 the Proceedings are in the mail. Price of the 1982 Proceedings to those who did not attend the 1982 Convention is \$10.00.
- (2) 1983 the 83 convention is ready to go. 78 advance reservations were reported.
- d. Historical Chairman Dean reported there has been no Committee activity. Frank reported that he is collecting the papers of the early technical symposiums for which there were no proceedings published.
- e. Journal Editor Ambroseno reported 17 pages of ads., approx. \$7000 worth. Journal is expected to go to press by the end of the year.

Item 6 - New Business

A new initiative to preserve the art of loran was discussed at length. Motivation derives from announcements by the Dept. of Defense to phase out financial support of loran in the near future. A consensus was developed that the goal of the new initiative would be (1) to inform all groups concerned with loran on a continuing basis regarding events, decisions, actions on the part of governments, agencies, departments, legislatures or others which impact the existance and/or quality of loran service available to the civil community world wide; and (2) to stimulate action on the part of addressees to press for the preservation of loran. A slogan was suggested: "Separate but Equal" navigation service.

Specifically, McGann will organize a series of luncheon meetings with government officials and others for purposes of discussion; and distribution lists will be developed for a "Save Loran" newsletter.

It was also agreed to promote the 25th Anniversary of Loran-C celebration and, to this end, develop a l page summary of loran highlights.

Item 7 - Next Meeting Date

In accordance with the resolution of the Board, the next meeting will be a meeting of the Executive Committee in December.
