About the Symposium

In order to augment or back-up GPS, the performance, integrity and operations of existing LORAN-C systems are being enhanced in several areas of the world. In the United States, the long-awaited completion of the Loran Evaluation was realized with the submittal of two documents on March 31, 2004: a Technical Evaluation from the FAA and USCG, and a Benefit Analysis for Volpe National Transportation Center. The Department of Transportation plans to make their decision public this summer. In Europe, there are significant movements within the context of the European Radionavigation Plan and individual national initiatives to expand Loran service and to find a successor to NELS. In Asia, several countries are considering expansion of service and capabilities, and keeping a watchful eye on technical developments worldwide. ILA 33 in Tokyo will bring key players from these programs together in what is expected to be one of the most vibrant Loran conferences ever.

The 33rd Annual ILA convention will include sessions on all aspects of LORAN-C with an emphasis on topics relating to eLoran. Papers are invited and are especially welcome on system and governmental policy, operational doctrine, applications, and new receiver and transmitter technology.
