Commodore David Squire retired from the Royal Fleet Auxiliary Service (RFA) in March 1999, after a long and distinguished career, which has spanned over 35 years and included a wide range of demanding appointments at sea and ashore, culminating in a 5 year appointment as Commodore and Chief Executive of the RFA.
